LOCATION

Site

Peachley Rise is situated on Peachley Lane, on the northern edge of the village of Lower Broadheath in Worcestershire, just 1.2 miles away from the boundary of Worcester Town and 3 miles away from Worcester Town Centre.

The location of Peachley Rise offers an unique opportunity for modern living in a historic village.







Site Layout

The design of the proposed layout creates **a residential development with a distinctive sense of place** that responds to existing landscape, topography, surrounding urban form and local built character.

The proposed layout has been designed to accommodate 4 spacious new homes, suitably located on generously sized serviced building plots towards the western and northern parts of the site.









CUSTOM BUILD

Self-Build and Custom Housebuilding

Self-build and Custom Housebuilding can be defined as the homebuilding process whereby "individuals, associations of individuals, or persons working with or for individuals or associations of individuals, build houses to be occupied as homes by those individuals".

This essentially means that the person who first lives in the house must have primary input into the final design and layout of the home, but not requiring the first occupant to make any physical contribution to the construction of the home.

This is a broad definition and covers a wide spectrum of models, from projects where individuals are involved in building or managing the construction of their home from beginning to end (self), to projects where individuals commission their home, making key design and layout decisions, but the home is built ready for occupation (custom turnkey).

Custom Housebuilding is a relatively new term, introduced by the government about ten years ago.

A customisable turnkey product, whereby the owner and first occupant has a direct say into the final design and layout of the home, whilst relying on an experienced enabler to manage the process and deliver the build, comes with the most benefits in terms of time, cost savings, certainty and avoidance of risk.


Worcester offers a unique blend of the old and new, making it a wonderful place to live, work, and explore.
